This joyful activity helped children:

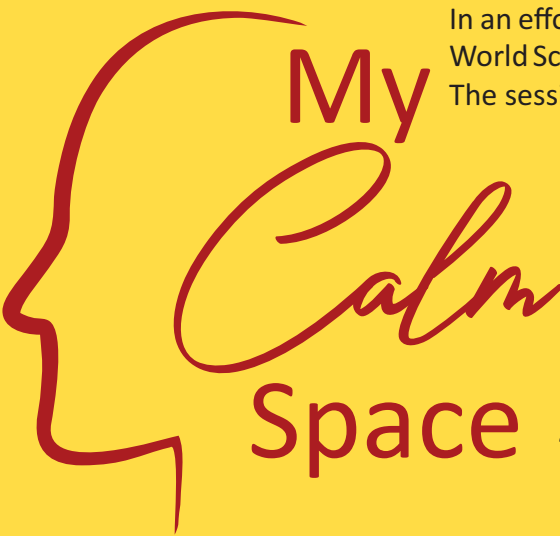
Improve their listening skills

Sanskrit Diwas Celebration

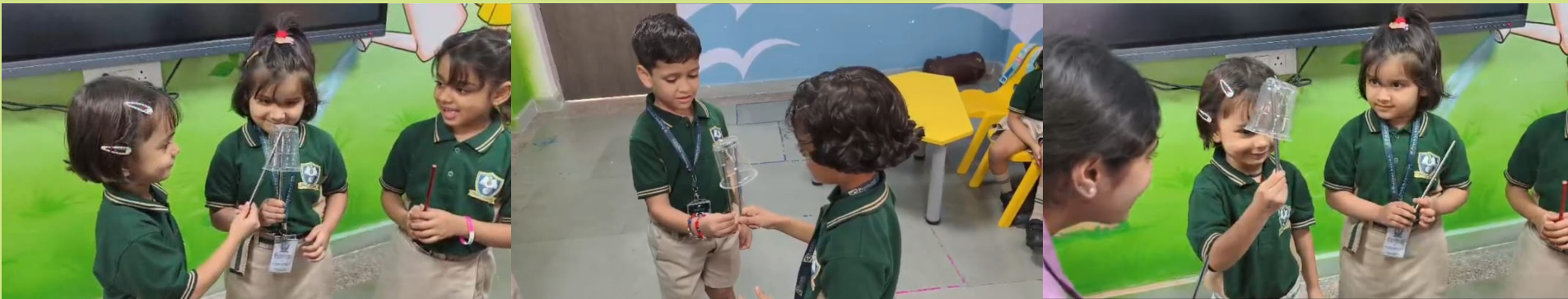
