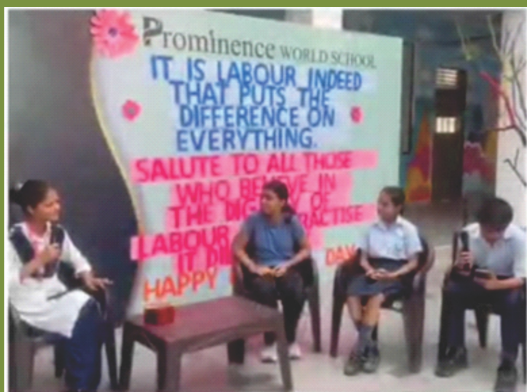

Because of this struggle, many countries began recognizing the importance of workers. May 1st was chosen as International Labour Day to remember those who fought for workers' rights. In some countries like USA and Canada, Labour Day is celebrated in September, but most of the world is on May 1st. Labour Day reminds us the value of workers and the importance of fair treatment in the workplace.

Inspired by research in neurodevelopmental learning, these activities promote mind-body coordination, essential in a gadget-distracted generation.

**Shivani Gupta's Interactive Session at Prominence World School**

Prominence World School, Greater Noida, recently had the pleasure of hosting Ms. Shivani Gupta — a Communications and Language Expert, Teacher Trainer, Curriculum Designer, and published author — for an inspiring session on "How to Write a Storybook." The session was designed to ignite creativity among young minds and offer them practical tools to start their journey as budding authors.

With over two decades of rich experience in teaching, training, and content creation, Ms. Gupta brought an energetic and engaging presence to the workshop. Her session was tailored for students who dream of writing their own stories but often struggle with where and how to begin.

**The 10 Essentials of Story Writing**

Ms. Gupta began by breaking down the process of story writing into 10 major focus points. These included:

- Idea Generation — Starting with a spark or theme.
- Setting — Choosing the right place and time for the story.
- Characters — Building believable and relatable characters.
- Plot Structure — Planning the beginning, middle, and end.
- Conflict — Creating problems that drive the narrative.
- Dialogue — Making characters speak naturally and meaningfully.
- Point of View — Choosing the narrator's voice.
- Pacing — Balancing action and description.
- Language and Style — Using descriptive and engaging vocabulary.
- Editing and Revising — The importance of reviewing and refining drafts

Each point was illustrated with relatable examples, and students were encouraged to think about their favorite stories and what made them memorable.

**STORYTELLING WITH A SPARK****Introducing the DICE Method**

To make story planning even more accessible, Ms. Gupta introduced the DICE Method — an acronym that stands for:

D — Develop your idea  
I — Imagine your characters and world  
C — Create a conflict  
E — End with impact

This simplified model made it easier for students to structure their thoughts and plan their stories in a logical, creative manner.

**Bookalooza: A Platform for Young Writers**

Towards the end of the session, Ms. Gupta introduced the children to Bookalooza, a budding online platform that provides young writers with an opportunity to publish and showcase their work. She motivated students to begin writing their own short stories and assured them that age is never a barrier when creativity flows freely.

The session was marked by enthusiastic participation. Students eagerly responded to prompts, asked insightful questions, and even shared some of their own story ideas. Ms. Gupta's warm demeanor, rich experience, and interactive approach made the session not only educational but also truly enjoyable.

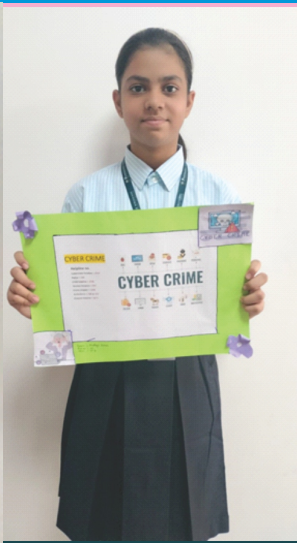
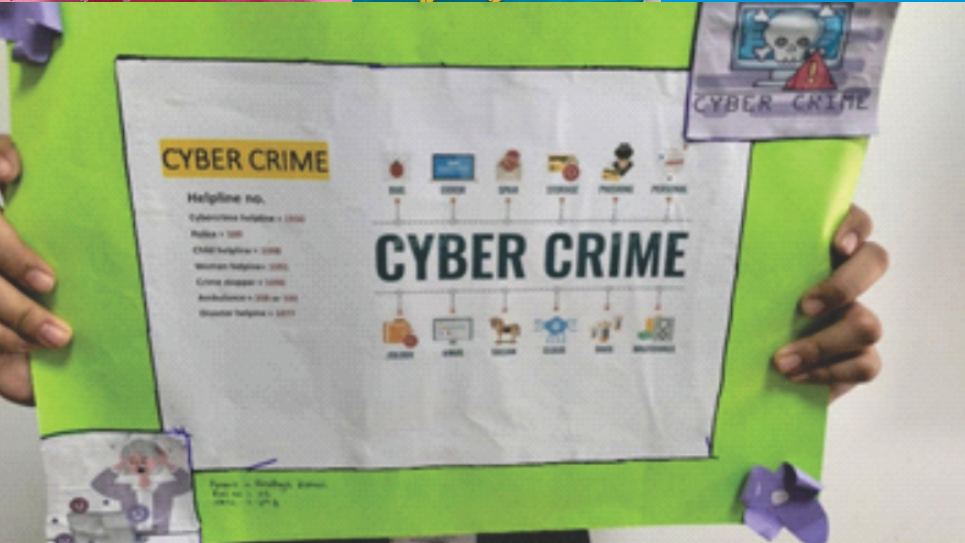

This rare coincidence makes the day deeply significant and spiritually charged.

At its core, Buddha Purnima is a symbol of self-realization—a reminder that the journey to peace, truth, and happiness begins within. Lord Buddha's life is the perfect example of this. Born as Prince Siddhartha Gautama, he lived a life of luxury and comfort, but a deep sense of dissatisfaction led him on a spiritual quest. After years of meditation and seeking, he attained enlightenment under the Bodhi tree in Bodh Gaya, Bihar.

**Bodhi Tree Connection:** The Mahabodhi Tree in Bodh Gaya is a direct descendant of the tree under which Buddha attained enlightenment. Devotees flock there on Buddha Purnima.

**UN Recognition:** In 1999, the United Nations recognized Vesak as an international day of observance.
